


CK loves rural students

This 40 year old farmer processes a degree in archeology and museology.....not agriculture. But, his contribution to agriculture is sometimes

more than that of many farm researchers from various UASs in India.

What drives him is unimaginable obsession for research, conservation of indigenous rice varieties in his 20 acre farmland in Kirugaval, Malavalli Taluk, Mandya......in India!

Meet him, meet Mr. Syed Ghani Khan, who is a proud collector & conservator of over 800 paddy varieties, 120 mango varieties and 30 vegetable & medicinal plants......all indigenous and organic.....and enviable too! All these varieties cultivated in a wide diversity of wet & dry lands in **Bada Bagh** of Mr. Ghani are now substance for the farm scientists for research, farmers for replication, ecologists for conservation & for farm students an upgradation & inspiration.

Mr. Ghani, who believes firmly that he is doing his bit in reviving the traditional farming, is a recipient of **Krishi Pandit Award**. An activist of the **Save our Rice Campaign**, anchored by **Sahaja Samruddha** in Karnataka, Mr. Ghani has varieties from Malasia, Myanmar & Thailand also in his treasure house of rice.

Considering his contribution in saving the Rice varieties from extinction, he was awarded **Plant Genome Savior Farmer Recognition by the Central Government in 2012.**

He chose organic path to chemical

A variety of farm animals, besides being a good source of organic manure for Bada Bagh, have helped Mr. Ghani in his strenuous journey of conversion from chemical to organic farming.

Dotting Papaya, Guava & Sugarcane also in his farm, he humbly confesses that his farming may not be fully

scientific, but 100% systematic. As an expert in concoction of selected medicinal leaves to combat pests and diseases, he uses ten types of pulses to ensure good fertility of the land.

Intensely passionate with whatever they are doing, the whole family of Ghani has shared their seeds with more than 6,000 farmers across Karnataka and outside the state. Some farmers are exchanging the seeds & returning double the quantity of seeds after harvesting.

Mr. Ghani also organises a field day during the harvest season to help farmers to choose the variety that

best suits their farmlands. Some rice varieties are also exported to Dubai and Abu Dhabi.

After visiting his farm & the hard work put in by Ghani, a non-agriculture graduate & the whole family, you can hear an involuntary remark that the UASs & researchers should join hands with them in conservation & propagation of the indigenous varieties.
